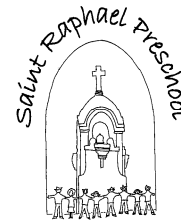

Mission Gift Shop Weekend Volunteers Needed!



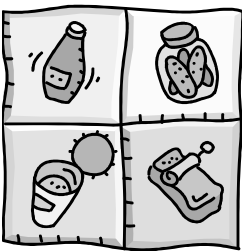

THE UNWELCOME AMONG US

The readings that we hear proclaimed at liturgy this weekend should make most of us feel slightly uneasy. If one listens to them through a historical perspective there may be no reaction in that one is hearing about a disease that we have no experience with. It is important to remember that lepers in Jesus' day were required by Jewish law to segregate themselves from normal society. They could not live in town, they could not associate with anyone who did not have leprosy and they could not worship with the community.

What does this have to do with us this weekend? The gospel challenges us to define who the outcasts in our society are today. Luckily, few people are excluded by laws but we exclude many people due to social rejection or other dynamics. How do we welcome the stranger among us when we gather for liturgy? How do we ensure as a community that no one is excluded from Saint Raphael?

I know that each of us has had the experience of feeling like an outsider at a gathering. When no one offers a greeting or acknowledges that you are there, you feel like you don't belong. The same thing is true for liturgy. The Bishops of the United States stressed this when they wrote a pastoral resource letter published in 2003. They quoted Saint Paul's instructions to the Romans which stressed, "Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you."

Why is the subject of hospitality so difficult for Catholics? Thomas Richstatter, OFM, writes "Perhaps one reason Catholics did not feel the need to welcome people coming to Sunday Mass was that we had been taught we "had to go". Inviting Catholics to Sunday Mass was simply unnecessary." Richstatter continues by comparing hospitality and reverence. He writes, "Some Catholics think this whole "welcoming" business is destroying our traditional reverence and replacing it with a 'feel-good' experience. This is a false conclusion. If you wish to invite a guest into your home, you must have space. You have to "make room." To invite others into our hearts and our worship, we must make room for them."

There is a deep motivation for welcoming strangers in our midst. Often the Lord comes with them or in them. Our openness to others is a good indication of the openness of our hearts to the Lord and to what God wants to offer us. Opening up one's heart is basic to spiritual growth. When we recognize this we realize that hospitality is more than being friendly and is not the exclusive job for just a few people. We must all take responsibility for the ministry of hospitality. It is nothing less than welcoming God into our hearts and lives.

NOTAS LITURGICAS

LOS QUE NO SON ACOGIDOS ENTRE NOSOTROS

Las lecturas que escuchamos proclamar en la liturgia este fin de semana debe crear un poquito de incomodidad entre la mayoría de nosotros. Si uno las escucha a través de la perspectiva histórica puede que no haya reacción porque uno no esta escuchando a cerca de una enfermedad que no hemos tenido. Es importante recordar que los leprosos en los tiempos de Jesús según la ley Judía tenían que ser segregados de la sociedad normal. No podían vivir en el pueblo, no podían asociarse con nadie que no fuese leproso y no podían alabar con la comunidad.

¿Qué tiene que ver esto con nosotros este fin de semana? El Evangelio nos desafía a que definamos quienes son los marginados en nuestra sociedad hoy. Afortunadamente, pocas personas son excluidas por las leyes pero nosotros excluimos a muchas personas debido al rechazo social u otras dinámicas. ¿Cómo acogemos a los extraños entre nosotros cuando nos reunimos para la liturgia? ¿Cómo nos aseguramos que como comunidad nadie es excluido de la Iglesia de San Rafael?

Sé que cada uno de nosotros ha tenido la experiencia de sentirse como un extraño en una reunión. Cuando nadie ofrece un saludo o reconoce que estamos presentes, podemos sentirnos que no pertenecemos. Lo mismo pasa en la liturgia. Los Obispos de los Estados Unidos recalcan esto cuando escriben en la carta pastoral publicada en el 2003. Ellos usan las palabras de San Pablo en la carta a los Romanos la cual recalca: "Recíbanse unos a otros, como Cristo los ha recibido".

¿Porqué es este tema de hospitalidad tan difícil para los Católicos? Thomas Richstatter, OFM, escribe: "Talvés una de las razones por las cuales los Católicos no sienten la necesidad de recibir a la gente que viene a la Misa Dominical es porque se nos ha enseñado que "tenemos que ir". Invitar a los Católicos a la Misa Dominical era simplemente innecesario". Richstatter continua comparando la hospitalidad y la reverencia. El escribe: "Algunos Católicos piensan que esta cuestión de "recibir" esta destruyendo nuestra reverencia tradicional y la esta reemplazando con una experiencia "para sentirse bien". Esta es una falsa conclusión. Si desea invitar a un amigo a su casa, debe tener el espacio. Debe de "hacer el espacio". Para invitar a otros a su corazón y nuestra alabanza, tenemos que hacerles lugar".

Hay una gran motivación para darle la bienvenida al extraño entre nosotros. Con frecuencia el Señor viene con ellos o en ellos. Nuestra apertura a otros es una Buena indicación de la apertura de nuestros corazones al Señor y a lo que Dios nos quiere ofrecer. Abrir nuestros corazones es básico para el crecimiento espiritual. Cuando reconocemos esto nos damos cuenta que la hospitalidad es más que ser amigable y no es un trabajo exclusive para solo algunas personas. Todos debemos tomar responsabilidad del ministerio de la hospitalidad. Es el darle la bienvenida a Dios en nuestros corazones y vidas.

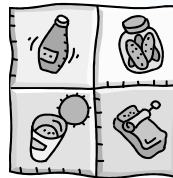
